

**CITY OF PLEASUREVILLE**  
**ORDINANCE NO. ~~26~~ 1**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF FIREWORKS  
WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF PLEASUREVILLE, KENTUCKY**

Whereas, KRS 227.750 authorizes local governments to enact ordinances regulating the sale and use of fireworks;

Whereas, the City Commission of the City of Pleasureville has determined it is in the best interest of the City to enact regulations governing use of fireworks within the City limits;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Pleasureville, Kentucky as follows:

1. USE OF FIREWORKS PERMITTED

Persons may use, ignite, fire or explode those fireworks authorized by KRS Chapter 227 and this Ordinance within the City. Fireworks, including consumer fireworks, may only be used between the hours of noon and 10:00 p.m. on June 27<sup>th</sup> and July 5<sup>th</sup> and between the hours of noon and 11:00 p.m. on July 4<sup>th</sup> of any year.

2. PERMIT

Any person wishing to use, ignite, fire, or explode those fireworks authorized by KRS Chapter 227 and this Ordinance on any other days shall obtain a permit from the Pleasureville Fire Chief or his designee with the issuance of a permit conditioned on the applicant complying with all applicable state and local laws, rules, and regulations.

- A. This permit application shall be filed no later than fifteen (15) days prior to the proposed use of the fireworks and shall be on a form provided by the City.
- B. The permit, if granted, shall be valid for a four (4) hour period on the permitted date between the hours of noon and 9:00 p.m.
- C. The Pleasureville Fire Department may charge a fee for the Permit in an amount not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00), payable to the Pleasureville Fire Department.

3. RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF FIREWORKS

Consumer fireworks, as defined in KRS Chapter 227 may only be used by individuals at least eighteen (18) years of age and shall not be ignited within two hundred (200) feet of any structure, vehicle, or any other person. Fireworks, including consumer fireworks, shall not be

ignited or discharged from a motor vehicle and shall not be ignited or discharged on property of another with the consent of the owner or occupant or on public property.


4. PENALTY


Any person found in violation of this Ordinance shall be subject to civil penalty, and/or criminal sanctions. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, or both. The Pleasureville Fire Chief may revoke or suspend the permit of any person or business entity that violates the provisions of this Ordinance.

5. MISCELLANEOUS

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any section, phrase, or provision shall for any reason be declared invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance. All prior Municipal Orders or Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
